To provide diversified exposure to securities across global credit markets, with the flexibility to adapt its credit and cash exposure to suit market conditions across the credit cycle, and deliver consistent levels of income.

Portfolio and Market Returns

The Bentham Global Opportunities Fund - Class A had a before fees return of 1.75% for the month, outperforming the benchmark by 1.37%. The top contributors to performance included USD Currency exposure, interest rate positioning and Global Syndicated Loans; whilst the bottom performing contributors included High Yield Bonds and Capital Securities.

Portfolio Asset Allocation

During the month, exposures to Cash, Global High Yield and Global Syndicated Loans increased, whilst exposures to Basis Trades, Government Backed Bonds (Emerging Market) and Equity decreased. Current asset allocations are 35.3% in Global Syndicated Loans, 22.7% in Investment Grade Corporate Credit, 11.7% in Capital Securities, 2.4% in Collateralised Loan Obligations, 1.8% in Asset Backed Securities, 0.9% in Global Hybrids, 0.3% in Equity, -2.0% in Government Backed Bonds (EM), -15.1% in Global High Yield and 41.8% in Cash, Derivatives & Credit Hedges.

Portfolio Industry and Issuer Exposures

The Fund's largest industry exposures are: 16.9% in Banking, 13.0% in Sovereign, Quasi Sovereign, Municipal and 5.9% in Electronics. The Fund's top three company exposures are: 4.3% in Queensland Treasury Corp, 3.5% in Commonwealth Bank Of Australia and 2.7% in New South Wales Treasury Corp.

Leveraged Loan Market

The top performing leveraged loan industries in December were Metals/Minerals, Consumer Durables and Retail with returns (sector performance in USD terms) of 1.24%, 1.08% and 1.05% respectively. The worst performing loan industries were Food And Drug, Food/Tobacco and Manufacturing with returns of -0.51%, 0.25% and 0.41% respectively.


